Dear Friends,

When I began the ministry process my biggest concern was evangelism. I was good at serving God, but I wasn't comfortable talking with others about my faith. I wasn't sure how to be a minister if I couldn't share my faith stories in one-on-one conversations. My faith sharing up to that point had always been through drama and the arts. I wrote plays and skits, songs and musicals, that expressed my faith and invited others into a relationship with God; but sitting down with a total stranger and asking if they had a personal relationship with Jesus Christ was terrifying!

What I learned over the years was that faith sharing was just that — sharing my faith with others. It wasn't about trying to make someone believe what I believed, or convert them to Christianity. It was about sharing God's love through word and action. I didn't have to put someone on the spot or decide whether or not they were saved. I simply needed to be kind and loving, compassionate and merciful. And if someone asked me about God I didn't have to recite a doctrine; I just needed to share how God has worked in my life.

We each have a unique experience to share, and special gifts to offer. We bring our stories to the table and we give them voice through word and deed. How we live our daily lives is just as important as the words we share. Often, our lived faith is even more important than what we say because we live in a society where people are quick to espouse a belief, but slow to act on it. I encourage you to live your faith and let others see God's love in you, and through you. By doing so, you may just change the world.

## **COMING UP IN AUGUST/SEPTEMBER WORSHIP**


Join us for 10:00 am Worship on Sundays, in-person, or livestreaming on our Facebook page.




Linnea Geno's Pick for August

# PRACTICE LECTIO DIVINA (DIVINE READING)

One of the most ancient ways to experience the Bible comes through a practice called *lectio divina* (Latin for "divine reading"). The practice moves through four phases with an underlying confidence that God speaks to us whenever we read the Bible. The first step is to read the passage over and over, savoring each word and waiting for one to rise above the rest. Once a single word or phrase sticks in your mind, you begin to explore the word. What feelings, emotions or memories does it evoke? After a time of experiencing the word, it's time to ask and listen to God for the answer to what this word is meant to say to you. Why this word? What is God saying? Finally, use the word as a focus point to let go of every distracting thought so that you can rest in the presence of God.
